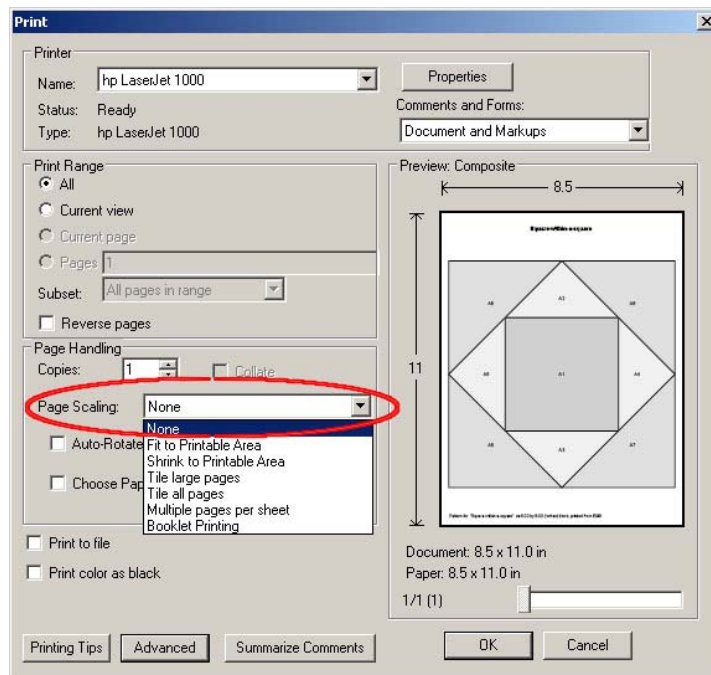


Sunset Country Quilters Guild  
Block of the Month  
2009-2010

Row 3—Square within a Square (8")

Determine the number of 8" blocks required for the size of quilt you have chosen.

When going to print, be sure the 'Page Scaling' option is set to 'None'.



This should provide you the proper size of the image. Print 1 copy and measure the outside of the square. It should be exactly 8". If it is, print the number of sheets you need for your row. You will have to add ¼" to the outside of the pattern for seam allowance.

You may precut your fabric to give you pieces just a little larger than needed and result in straight of grain edges on your block.

For *each* block cut:

Light

1 – 4 ¾" square (A1);

2 – 6 ¼" squares cut diagonally once to give you 4 triangles (A6, A7, A8, A9).

Dark

2 – 4" squares cut diagonally once to give you 4 triangles (A2, A3, A4, A5).

Sew the fabrics to the wrong side of the foundation in the order given. Press well. Trim block to 8 ½" adding ¼" inch outside of printed pattern. Remove paper.
